In evaluating previous claims made by Salt Lake County to roads under RS2477, my staff has met with District Ranger for the United States Forest Service, representatives from the environmental community, and the Salt Lake County District Attorney's Office. Records have been reviewed and onsite inspections completed. After much dialog, research and deliberation, I have decided to withdraw any current or future claim by Salt Lake County for the following roads under RS2477.

- Killyons Canyon
- Little Mountain
- Extension for Millcreek Canyon Road
- Church Fork
- Porter's Fork
- Pole Canyon
- Alexander Fork
- Mill D North Fork
- Mill F East Fork
- Mill D South fork
- Mineral Fork
- Silver Fork
- Days Fork
- Honeycomb Fork
- Willow Heights Canyon
- American Hollow
- Yellow Fork
- Butterfield Canyon
- Rose Canyon

We believe we have rights-of-way for the paved portion of Burrs Fork, Emigration Canyon, Lambs Canyon, and Millcreek Canyon. If further research indicates that we do not have a right-of-way on any part of these roads, we will submit an application to the Forest Service for an easement rather than making a claim under RS2477.
